





AN AFTERNOON WITH SHELBY VAN PELT AUTHOR OF REMARKABLY BRIGHT CREATURES

The 2023 Thousand Oaks Reads: One City One Book is *Remarkably Bright Creatures: A Novel* by Shelby Van Pelt.

A luminous debut novel about a widow's unlikely friendship with a giant Pacific octopus reluctantly residing at the local aquarium—and the truths she finally uncovers about her son's disappearance 30 years ago.



After Tova Sullivan's husband died, she began working the night shift at the Sowell Bay Aquarium, mopping floors and tidying up. Keeping busy has always helped her cope. As she works, Tova becomes acquainted with curmudgeonly Marcellus, a giant Pacific octopus. Marcellus knows more than anyone can imagine, but wouldn't dream of lifting one of his eight tentacles for his human captors—until he forms an unlikely friendship with Tova.

Ever the detective, Marcellus deduces what happened the night Tova's son disappeared. As his affection for Tova grows, Marcellus must use every trick his old, invertebrate body can muster to unearth the truth for her before it's too late.

Born and raised in the Pacific Northwest, Shelby Van Pelt lives in the suburbs of Chicago with her family. *Remarkably Bright Creatures* is her first novel.

Tickets are required for this event and will be available at both the Newbury Park and Grant R. Brimhall Libraries beginning February 25, 2023.
